

RESTORE ILLINOIS PLAN

On June 11, 2021, the state of Illinois enters Phase 5 of the "Restore Illinois" reopening plan.

Phase 5

To advance to Phase 5, the state must reach a 50% vaccination rate for residents age 16 and over and meet the same metrics and rates required to enter the transition phase, over an additional 28-day period.

With testing, tracing and treatment widely available throughout the state, all sectors of the economy reopen with businesses, schools, and recreation resuming normal operations with new safety guidance and procedures. Conventions, festivals, and large events can take place.

Face Masks or Face Coverings

Face coverings continue to be recommended for unvaccinated persons, as well as all individuals on planes, buses, trains, and other forms of public transportation; in transportation hubs, such as airports and train and bus stations; in congregate facilities such as correctional facilities, veterans' homes, and long-term care facilities, group homes, and residential facilities; and in healthcare settings.

Businesses and venues should continue to allow for social distancing to the extent possible, especially indoors. Businesses and venues may also continue to put in place additional public health mitigations as they deem appropriate, including requiring face coverings.

Small Business Assistance

To provide aid for small businesses in Illinois that have been impacted by the COVID-19 crisis, the State of Illinois has announced two financial assistance programs for small businesses. To learn more and apply, click [here](#).

Business Interruption Grants (BIG)

The Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) has launched a second round of [Business Interruption Grants \(BIG\)](#) which includes:

- [\\$60 million for Heavily Impacted Industries](#), such as movie theaters, performing arts venues, concert venues, indoor recreation, amusement parks, and more.
- [\\$70 million for Disproportionately Impacted Areas](#), defined by zip code for communities that are most economically distressed and vulnerable to COVID-19. A map of DIAs is shown below.
- [Over \\$100 million for Downstate Communities](#)
- [\\$5 million for Livestock Production disruptions](#).
- [Loan Forgiveness for Illinois Small Business Emergency Loan recipients](#) Grants will go to businesses that have received loans or remain on the wait list and the program will sunset.

Businesses outside the categories listed above are also eligible to apply and receive funding under the program but may be reviewed later than priority businesses. All businesses will receive a decision on their grant application within four to six weeks of application submission.

Funding may be used to help businesses with working capital expenses, including payroll costs; rent; utilities; and other operational costs as defined in program details.

ComEd's Small Business Assistance Program

As of December 16, 2020, ComEd is accepting applications for assistance that would be applied to a business' bill in 2021 if they meet all qualifications.

The Small Business Assistance Program provides eligible small business customers, with a one-time grant up to \$2,000 towards a past due balance. Eligible customers may also place a remaining balance into a payment plan of up to six months. To apply for the Small Business Assistance Program, please call 1-877-426-6331

With the state in Phase 5 or the Restore Illinois plan, restaurants and bars can return to full capacity. Restaurants and bars may continue offering curbside take-out and delivery sales of alcohol, operate City-approved temporary outdoor seating areas and continue the temporary sales and delivery of "to go" mixed drinks/cocktails.

Those interested in creating an outdoor seating area should view the Quick Guide and FAQs at cityofelgin.org/outdoorseating to determine what is necessary for their business to create a space while complying with state guidelines and providing the City with necessary documents.
