



- All funds must be expended by December 31, 2026

Premium Pay and Revenue Loss


Neither being recommended for consideration

City's 2020 expenditure reductions—including employee furloughs, zero wage increases—enabled City to end 2020 budget year without a loss.

City's frontline employees shared risks similar with employees in essential Elgin businesses that are not receiving premium pay for the work they performed during the pandemic.

Combined Sewer Separation


- Single most important initiative for preserving and enhancing quality of the Fox River
- Ten combined sewer outfalls discharge sewage overflow into the Fox River
- City agreement with EPA mandates an average of no more than four overflows annually by 2031
- \$90 million for remaining combined sewer replacement



INVESTMENTS IN WATER, SEWER
AND BROADBAND

Broadband

- “Under the interim final rule, eligible projects are expected to focus on locations that are unserved or underserved.”
- Elgin ITS Director Jeff Massey’s knowledge of the incidence of Elgin’s broadband coverage indicates there are no unserved or underserved areas of significance within the city.

Affordable Housing

2021 CDBG Programming

- Affordable Housing Fund \$337,000
- Healthy Homes Rehab Program \$620,000
- E. Chicago Street Planning Study \$75,000

FHA relaxing way it assesses student-loan debt when weighing eligibility for homebuying assistance
Helps lower-income borrowers and narrows racial gap in home ownership

PUBLIC HEALTH/NEGATIVE ECONOMIC IMPACTS

Affordable Housing

CRA being rewritten by Federal Reserve for hundreds of billions of dollars in lending and investment in lower-income neighborhoods.

- CRA is 1977 law aimed at ending “redlining”—banks’ practice of avoiding lending in certain areas, often minority neighborhoods.
- Proposed changes updating rules from law enacted more than 40 years ago, before advent of the internet, when most banking was conducted at local branches.

IL bill providing property tax incentives for developers setting aside some units in their projects for low- to moderate-income residents.

- 30-year reduction in property tax assessments—and lower taxes as a result—for setting aside 20 percent of units for tenants earning 60 percent or less of median income.
- Bill also includes tax breaks designed to spark construction or preservation of affordable housing in less expensive neighborhoods and in areas that are gentrifying.



PUBLIC HEALTH/NEGATIVE ECONOMIC IMPACTS

Mental Health/708 Board



Named for the House of Representatives Resolution 708 that created such entities

708 boards respond to the local mental health, substance use disorder, and developmental disability needs of their constituents

Small tax of up to 0.15 percent of the assessed value of a home (~\$80–\$90 per year on average) is collected

708 board then responsible for putting out a request for proposals that will stipulate who is eligible for funding

Elgin Township and Dundee Township voters approved referendum in March 2020*

- Kane County Clerk's Office refused to levy the voter-approved tax, citing a mistake in the way the referendum question was worded on the ballot.
- Contention is Property Tax Extension Limitation Law guidelines—also known as the Tax Cap Law—not followed. As a result, voters may not have realized a “yes” vote would increase their property taxes.
- First court hearing on August 20th.


